AGE DIVISIONS: Individual Baton Solo Events: 0-6, 7-9, 10-12, 13-15, 16-18; 19-22

Boys Baton Solo (boys will be separate from girls in one-baton solo only): 5-9, 10-14, 15+

Dance-Twirl Freestyle: 5-9; 10-12; 13-15; 16-18; 19-22

Novelty Freestyle: (All Levels) 5-9; 19-22; (Beg/Adv Levels) 10-12; 13-15; 16-18

Baton Individual Events- One Baton, Two Baton, Multiple Baton. X-Strut, Straight line Strut, Parade Strut, Basic Strut, Military Strut, Novelty Freestyle, Dance-Twirl Freestyle, Collegiate Halftime Routine, Collegiate Downfield Strut, All-Around Twirling Champion (includes Collegiate Champion, see grid).

Sports Press Presentation: Contestants will be interviewed by a "Sports Reporter" and have the opportunity to present their twirling and performance skills. Twirlers will be interviewed about baton twirling and their twirling experiences and present a 30 second routine in a designated area as though a camera was filming. Routine may exist of twirling (one baton, strutting, and poses to display twirler's skills and represent the best of baton twirling.

AAU World Twirling Challenge- High School and Collegiate Twirlers can vie for the title of 2025 Twirler of All Trades. This is a two-part competition. Part A will consist of the athletes competing with a Novelty Solo routine to music of their choice (AAU Novelty Solo Time Limit Applies). The Top 3 winners for each division will advance to finals. In the final's competition, athletes will be given a set song to which they must choreograph a one baton Dance-Twirl Solo (Time limit will be 1:30 Max). Along with the regular criteria, athletes will be judged on creativity, expressiveness, and their interpretation of the musical selection. A cash prize will be awarded.

Age Divisions: Elementary School, Middle School, High School, Collegiate.

Individual Baton Status Levels: Challenger, Novice, Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced will be offered. College level will also be offered in the All-Around Champion event, Collegiate Half-Time and Collegiate Downfield Strut events.

Baton Corps- Twirling Corps and Parade Corps. Beginner and Advanced Status.

Baton Teams: Twirling Team (March Music), Dance-Twirl Team, Novelty Twirl Team, Street Parade Team, Show-Twirl Team, College Majorette Line, Auxiliary Teams (Pom Line, Dance Line, Drill Team, Guard, Majorette Line). Beginner and Advanced Status.

Baton/Dance Team Sizes- Extra-Small Team (Twirling Team, Dance-Twirl Team, Novelty Twirl Team, Auxiliary Majorette): 2-3 Athletes Small Teams: 4-9 athletes; Large Teams: 10-19 athletes; Extra Large Teams: 20+

Dance Individual/Team Events- Jazz/Lyrical, Hip Hop, Modern/Contemporary and Pom.

ALL AROUND TWIRLING CHAMPION:

AAU MEMBERSHIP:

All athletes and coaches must be current AAU members. To join, visit www.aausports.org and click on JOIN AAU to become a member of the AAU. BE PREPARED and register your coaches early! You can no longer register for non-athlete (coach) membership on site at the event, background screens are conducted for all non-athletes and adult athletes and can take up to 10 business days.

REGISTRATION & ENTRY DEADLINE:

All Entries must be completed online no later than Tuesday June 30th, 2025 11:59 PM EST at www.aaujrogames.org. Visa, Master Card, American Express or Discover are accepted. All fees are non-refundable.

You will need to have your AAU membership at the time of registering for the AAU Junior Olympic Games. After registering online for the events in which you have qualified, you will receive an email confirming your entry and acceptance of payment. Once you have registered and paid online, there is no need to send in any paperwork.

Note: Only AAU registered COACHES are authorized to complete Corps, Teams, Duet and Trio Events. Parents, coaches, etc. may enter individual solo events.

The Local Organizing Committee and the AAU spend many hours planning and preparing for this AAU Event. In order to make it a great success, we are asking for your cooperation. It is the responsibility of the coach, parent, instructor, and athlete to ensure that the application is complete in every detail and processed on time.

AGE

DETERMINATION: The athlete's age will be determined by the athlete's actual age as of July 31, 2025

SUBMITTING MUSIC:

ALL Team and solo events that require music must email the music director an MP3 file to kemericaau@gmail.com by the July 5th entry deadline. Music will be played on a laptop through the sound system at the contest. Team directors and Solo Dancers should also bring a back-up copy for your music.

If your music is NOT turned in by the AAU Junior Olympic Games/National Competition entry deadline of July 5, 2025, a \$25 late fee will be applied to the entry. This fee will be due at check-in at the AAU Junior Olympic Games or AAU National Baton Competition. This fee will apply to solos as well as teams

COACHES:

All AAU Baton Twirling Coaches wishing to have access to the practice area and competition floor will be given a Baton Lanyard with special access backstage.

To register for the AAU Junior Olympic Games Baton Twirling and Dance Championships, visit www.aaujrogames.org and register on line. The coaches' entry is \$40 and includes a coaches' gift, t-shirt, and event credentials (allowing access to ALL competition venues). The coaches' registration fee is in addition to your non-athlete membership fee. On site coach entry may be accepted with a \$10 late fee (\$50 total); however, you must have your non-athlete membership number to register as a coach on site.

Baton Twirling and Dance participants must check-in at the George R. Brown Convention Center to receive their athlete credential or coach wristband. The appropriate credential or wristband will be needed prior to gaining admittance into the competition venues. If that credential or wristband is lost or stolen there will be a replacement fee.
